# The National Federation of Families with the Mentally Ill in Japan and Model Stories.

We describe the process of organizing the federation of families with the mentally ill and “frames” provided by Zenkaren (the National Federation of Families with the Mentally Ill in JAPAN). Zenkaren, established in 1965, was the world’s oldest mental health family organization.

The concept of “frames” are defined as schemata of interpretation that allow an individual to identify and label life experiences. Frames can ally people to a social movement.

When families mention about frames in order to express their experiences, we call these frames model stories. Finally, we discuss about the relationship between these stories and the their lived experiences.
